Billund Airport

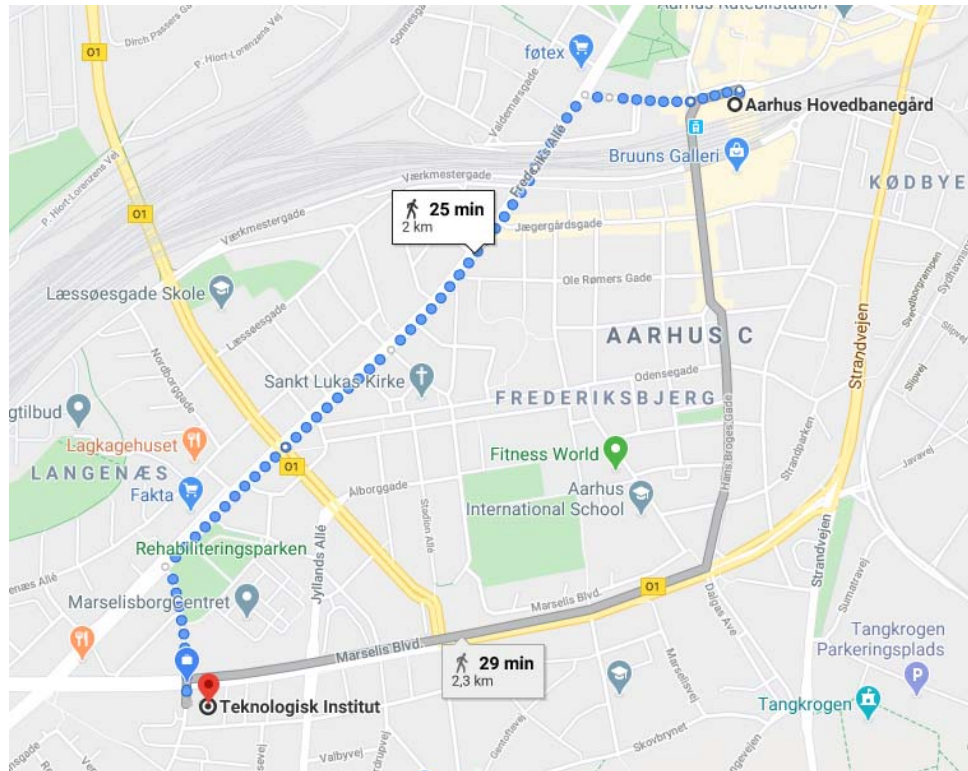
